In recent days, Rheinmetall Canada has reached a major milestone in completing over \$1B in Industrial and Technological Benefits transactions pertaining to its operations in Canada over the span of the last 30 years. The company, established under the name Oerlikon Aerospace, was formed in April 1986 as the Canadian home for Oerlikon's business in North America. The company's first mandate was to manufacture and provide support for the Air Defence Anti-Tank System (ADATS) missile system for the Canadian Forces Low-Level Air Defence (LLAD) program. Rheinmetall Canada has since proudly provided state-of-the-art equipment to the Canadian Armed Forces through a wide variety of products, ranging from Close Area Suppression Weapon system, Leopard Training Tanks and Shield Replacement with MASS for the Royal Canadian Navy. Up to this day, Rheinmetall Canada has achieved over \$1B in obligations under the IRB/ITB Policy out of a total of \$1.4B in commitments. ITB obligations have allowed us to create strong partnerships with suppliers from coast to coast", said Dr. Andreas Knackstedt, President and CEO of Rheinmetall Canada. "We have developed an expertise in fulfilling our obligations and clearly, it demonstrates that we are a reliable partner for the Canadian government" added Dr. Knackstedt.

The Industrial and Regional Benefits Policy and Industrial and Technological Benefits Policy require defence contractors and their major suppliers to invest an amount in Canada equal to the value of their defence contracts. This ensures that defence spending translates into economic benefits to Canada and jobs in regions across the country.
